

YOUR RIGHTS AS AN IMMIGRANT



IF ICE IS AT YOUR DOOR:

- Do not open the door. If you open the door, officials will consider that as permission to enter.
- Call the Santa Clara County Rapid Response Network (see front).
- If they have a warrant of removal signed by a judge, ask them to slip it under the door. If it is not signed or if they do not have a warrant, you are not required to open the door.
- Do not lie or give false documents.
- If the officers don't speak your language, ask for an interpreter.
- Exercise your fifth amendment right to remain silent.
- You have the right to ask for the names and identification numbers of ICE officers.



IF YOU ARE ARRESTED BY ICE:

- You have the right to a phone call.
- Do not sign anything in any language that you do not understand. Do not sign anything without a lawyer.
- If the officers don't speak your language, ask for an interpreter.
- Obtain a list of low-cost/free legal service providers in your local area if you cannot afford an attorney.

BE AWARE:

- Do not travel outside the country if you have a previous order of removal.
- If you have a previous arrest or conviction (even if it happened many years ago), always consult with an attorney or Department of Justice-accredited representative before planning to travel outside the country.
- Call the Rapid Response Network or seek legal representation if you are scheduled for an ICE check-in. Do not go alone.
- Seek legal support if you or a loved one are about to be released from prison or are currently in detention.
- If you have a green card, do not travel outside the country for more than six months.
- If you are receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI) from Social Security, do not travel outside the country for more than 30 days. If you plan to be away for 30 days or more, let Social Security know before you travel.
